**5. For Possible Action – Discussion and deliberation to review budgetary status including proposed expenditure status including revenue and expenditure projection of the 911 fund to determine if changes or updates are needed to the 5-year Master Plan.**

Chair Brad Adams discussed the review of the budgetary status, including proposed expenditures for the 911 fund. The five year master plan was presented and reflected decisions and recommendations from the previous meetings. Adams detailed specific expenditures for fiscal years 2025, 2026, 2027, including purchases, integrations and maintenance agreements. The

budget also included additional expenditures for facility and operational equipment improvements.

Adams then gave a detailed breakdown of the budget for fiscal year 2025, including the purchases being made from Motorola and Goserco. The budget for 2026 includes provisions for post-install support and dual dynamic mode licensing. For fiscal year 2027, the budge includes anticipated increases for software and dispatch console maintenance. The five-year master plan was discussed and reviewed with a focus on ensuring compliance with legal requirements and that the telecommunications infrastructure is accomplished within it.

Adams discussed the impact that tariffs will have on public safety equipment costs, particularly radios. He also discussed that the budge includes provisions for ongoing expenses such as 911 trunks and other dispatch console maintenance. He went in to fiscal year 2028 and advised that the budget at that point includes general improvements for dispatch, including facility and operational equipment.
