10 by the provisions of the attached Nye County Safety Program Policy.


11        BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this policy shall be effective immediately upon adoption and  
12 all Nye County employees shall comply with its requirements.



## 1. Training

- 1.1 Per [NRS 618.383](#), all Nye County employees are required to receive safety training. Elected or appointed officials will also be encouraged to participate in training, including training that may not be specifically required by the NRS. Per [NRS 618.383.2\(a\)](#), training must pay particular attention to areas where there is evidence of "recurring injuries." When an injury occurs, the Risk Management Department will create a specific safety training plan to train or retrain the employee involved to address the cause of their injury. When an injury occurs to an elected or appointed official, the elected or appointed official is encouraged to participate in a specific safety training plan to train or retrain the elected or appointed official.
- 1.2 All training must be conducted and made available in a language and format that is understandable to each employee, both verbal and written ([NRS 618.383.4](#)). The same will be provided to each elected or appointed official who elects to receive safety training. Safety training will be administered by the Nye County Risk Management Department or a designee which has been approved by the Nye County Risk Management Department.
- 1.3 A training schedule is found in Appendix A but should not be interpreted as being an exhaustive list of training that will be offered by the Nye County Risk Management Department. Legislative updates may necessitate additional training.

## 2. The Nye County Safety Committee

- 2.1 The Nye County Risk Management Department will establish a Nye County Safety Committee. The Nye County Safety Committee will create a set of bylaws governing the committee that will be approved by the Nye County Risk Management Department and be updated annually. The safety committee must include representatives of employees. If the employees are represented by a labor organization, the representatives of employees must be selected by the employees and not appointed by the employer ([NRS 618.383.2\(b\)](#)). A representative of employees while engaging in the business of a safety committee, including attendance at meetings, authorized inspections or any other activity of the committee, must be paid by his or her employer as if that



employee were engaged in the employee's usual work activities ([NRS 618.383.3](#)).

### 3. Written Workplace Safety Program

- 3.1 The Nye County Risk Management Department will establish a written workplace safety program and carry out the requirements of the program within 90 days after it is established ([NRS 618.383.1](#)).
- 3.2 The written workplace safety program and all training programs pursuant to NRS 618.383 must be conducted and made available in a language and format that is understandable to each employee ([NRS 618.383.4](#)). The written workplace safety program must be conducted and made available in a language and format that is understandable to each elected or appointed official.

### 4. Definitions

“Employer” defined. “Employer” means:

1. The State of Nevada, any state agency, county, city, town, school district or other unit of local government;
2. Any public or quasi-public corporation;
3. Any person, firm, corporation, partnership or association; and
4. Any officer or management official having direction or custody of any employment or employee ([NRS 618.095](#))

Employee” defined. “Employee” means every person who is required, permitted or directed by an employer to engage in any employment, or to go to work or be at any time in any place of employment, under any appointment or contract of hire or apprenticeship, express or implied, oral or written, whether lawfully or unlawfully employed ([NRS 618.085](#)).

“Elected or appointed official” defined. “Elected or appointed official” means a person elected or appointed to a position with a local government that involves the exercise of a local governmental power, trust or duty, including:

- (a) Actions taken in an official capacity which involve a substantial and material exercise of administrative discretion in the formulation of local governmental policy;
- (b) The expenditure of money of a local government; and
- (c) The enforcement of laws and regulations of the State or a local government ([NRS 281.611\(4\)](#)).
