Action requested: (Include what, with whom, when, where, why, and terms) Discussion and deliberation to: a. Accept a Funding Agreement with NyE Communities Coalition to provide funding for a Case Manager, Case Worker and services to the community through the FASTT/MOST Program for calendar year 2025 in the amount of \$94,854.00. No County match required; b. Execute the Funding Agreement; and c. Fund to 10283 Health and Human Services.	
Complete description of requested action: (Include, if applicable, background, impact, long-term commitment, existing county policy, future goals, obtained by competitive bid, accountability measures) NyE Communities Coalition will coordinate contracted services for the FASTT/MOST Program for the Community Deflection Program Manager to provide case management to inmates at the Nye County Detention Center a minimum of 40 hours per week to prevent recidivism by removing barriers through referrals, etc. and will ensure proper program oversight and reporting. The maximum total amount payable per this agreement will be \$94,854.00 within the budgetary term of January 1, 2025, to December 31, 2025. Reporting and invoices will be submitted monthly. Services provided through the Funding Agreement will be budgeted through the Health and Human Services Indigent Fund 10283. No County match is required.

Goal 1: To increase public safety by reducing recidivism.		
Outcome Objective 1a: RISK/NEED - To use the criminogenic risk and behavioral health needs framework and criminogenic-model to ensure 95% of the SAPTA-funded FASTT services are prioritized for moderate- to very-high risk individuals with moderate to high behavioral health needs.

Outcome Objective 1b: Screen at least 95% of the individuals referred to FASTT for their criminogenic risk-level, using the evidence-based Community Supervision Screening Tool (CSST).

Outcome Objective 1e: Based on the CST assessment, develop an individualized, comprehensive case plan for at least 75% of the individuals who score moderate to very high-risk to reoffend and who have a moderate to high behavioral health need. The case plans will be initiated in the jail, will specify the individual's risk level and criminogenic needs, and will be designed to transition the individual into the community.
